## FRIENDSHIP Broadway Crossword Puzzle





## Theatre World: Stay "In the Know"



#### "La La Land" on Broadway

Damien Chazelle's Oscar-winning film will be transformed into a stage show featuring music from the same team (music by Justin Hurwitz and lyrics by Benj Pasek and Justin Paul).

The 2017 hit made over \$470 million worldwide at the box office. A concert version of this film has been touring the world for six years already.

The stage musical will be directed by Bartlett Sher, who won a Tony Award for 2008's "South Pacific" and whose credits include 2018's take on "To Kill a Mockingbird".

#### "Thelma and Louise" Musical in Development

A musical adaption of the 1991 film "Thelma and Louise" is currently in development. It is reported that Amanda Seyfried and Evan Rachel Wood are both involved with this project.

The film follows the dynamic duo of Thelma and Louise. Thelma is a meek housewife, and Thelma is an independent waitress. So when they meet trouble that ultimately results in a murder case, they go on an adventure of their lives running from the law.

Neither Seyfried nor Wood have been on Broadway before. However, they have both worked on musical films. Seyfried's musical credits are "Les Miserables", "Mamma Mia", and "Mamma Mia 2". Wood was in "Across the Universe" and he also sang in "Frozen 2".

"My fun memory would be Wayne! You never knew if he knew his lines, so it was funny to see what he was going to come up with. It was just funny to work with him."

During our second show, Wayne Ally's character is describing this very sentimental moment that he remembered from time with his father, back in Italy. As Wayne is sitting there, getting ready to stand up to tell his monologue, I realize that his fly is down. Since this is a very touching moment, I really don't know what to do and he his standing there walking around with his fly open talking about the sad moment in his life. Later on, I mentioned to him that his fly was down and he told me that I should've said something because old men forget their fly all the time so it would've worked out for his character and he would've played it off! #### **Nunsense**

"My fun memory from Nunsense was that I was able to use some creative liberties with Sister Robert Anne. When I decided to pull my habit up between my legs and tuck it in the rope around my waist to ride the broom during the witch scene, I felt like I was free to become the witch from Wizard of Oz. Fun fact...I was Ms. Gulch but never got to play the witch in Wizard of Oz. Not that the wonderful actress in Oz wasn't great, I just felt like that role finally came full circle for me." "I had a great time during Nunsense, surrounding by so many encouraging, hilarious, talented, and incomparable women! I played the novice who aspired to be the world's first nun ballerina. Although, I had more trouble with a mannequin onstage than I did with the ballet! During the opening scene, I had to toss some fabric over this mannequin's head to cover it up. It would almost always slide right off, so I'd be throwing it over and over and over again! During some shows, one of my taller sisters would have to come over to help me place it because it would be going on for so long! I'm so grateful for those girls who kept me laughing when I was a nervous wreck and who helped me out when I was jumping around next to a mannequin."

#### **Addams Family**



"I had the pleasure of choreographing this absolutely fun musical with Center Stage Theatre during the fall of 2022. My favorite memory was when we had dance rehearsals at the museum and I taught the opening number "When You're An Addams." I love the laughter, the energy, the camaraderie, and the process of teaching and choreographing a dance number from the rehearsal to the stage. When you add all of the elements of a production and the curtain rises on opening night, it is pure magic." - Crystal Hodges

"It was our first night of rehearsal and we were learning choreography for the opening number. I only had four lines to nail: "Line dance...bunny hop...do the twist...rigor mortis!" Naturally, I couldn't get it right to save my life. Everyone was thrown off! People were stopping and laughing, shaking their heads, and I swear I saw the choreographer roll her eyes. I like to think it brought the cast together to see that Gomez was nobody to be intimidated by. Maybe it took the pressure off the other actors; maybe it stressed out the production team. Who would've thought that two months later we would put on a show that some people called "the best show" CST had done? Or that we would truly become like a family? That people would still bring up how much they loved the show months after it was over? I'm becoming a nostalgic dad all over again thinking about it. But in the end, we all had to move towards the darkness, leave behind what was comfortable, and bravely face the unknown. This happens at the end of every show, but "The Addams Family" was truly lightning in a bottle. If you were lucky enough to experience it, my hope is you walked away feeling like a true Addams."
