

We'd love to have you!








Theatre World: Stay "In the Know"

"Phantom"'s Final Haunt:

The longest-running show in Broadway history is Andrew Lloyd Webber's "The Phantom of the Opera", which debuted in 1988, winning seven Tony Awards including Best Musical. The final performance is scheduled for April 16th, 2023.

Producer Cameron Mackintosh has cited the production's high running costs, amid a lower tourist audience on Broadway, as the reason for the show's closure (several international productions of the show are still running). The pandemic is largely to blame for the fall in tourism and thus ticket sales.

Ironically, "Phantom" was originally supposed to close in February, but the closing date was extended eight weeks due the the demand in ticket sales. Ticket sales have also risen as a result of inflation.

Throughout the course of its 35-year Broadway run, "Phantom" has sold 19.8 million tickets and grossed \$1.3 billion.

"You don't want to run a great show into the ground," Mackintosh, who has also produced "Cats" and "Les Miserables", told the New York Times. "It's always been one of my mantras throughout my long career: There's an art to closing a show, as well as opening one."
